In the spirit of advancing educational and career opportunities for women, the Hilton Head Branch of AAUW is pleased to announce its 2010 Scholarship Program.

Thanks to member contributions and fundraising success, the branch will be able to offer three scholarship awards for the 2010-2011 academic year: \$500, \$1,000 and \$1,500.

To streamline and modernize the 2010-2011 Scholarship Program, efforts are underway to introduce technology to our scholarship application process. Thus, our branch is planning to provide an on-line application using a Hilton Head branch link on AAUW's statewide website:

www.aauw-sc.org. Applicants will be able to access scholarship information and print a copy of the scholarship application from the website. We hope to have this link available to potential applicants by October 16, 2009.

The application criteria remain the same as in previous years: a woman age 25 or older, an earned secondary school diploma or GED, a resident of Beaufort County south of the Broad River, and current or planned enrollment in an accredited 2 or 4 year college, university or vocational/technical school. You are encouraged to support the learning needs of local women by spreading the news about our scholarship Offerings.
