

Voter Registration Effort

Let's support NATIONAL VOTER REGISTRATION DAY on Tuesday September 23, 2014. Your Branch can organize a voter registration drive on that day. You may want to target a particular group of eligible voters such as college students, veterans or ethnic groups. You will need to be neutral about political parties or candidates in this effort. Find a public place like a shopping mall or college campus and ask permission from the proper authorities. CLICK HERE for SC Information.

Hilton Head Branch's Second Annual Summer Enrichment Program for Girls

"When three prominent community organizations whole-heartedly team with AAUW to provide a summer enrichment experience for middle school girls, we know we are doing something right", says Donna.

This is the second year that the **Hilton Head Branch** expanded its long
tradition of granting academic
scholarships to adult women to include
funding The Art and Science of
Lowcountry Nature, a summer learning
program for 15 young girls.

The program linked needs and resources of the local community by partnering with the Boys and Girls Club of Hilton Head, the Coastal Discovery Museum and the Arts Center of Coastal Carolina. The result was a week-long exploration of local ecology and science expressed through the creative arts.

Scientific sampling techniques examining phytoplankton and zooplankton were connected to making plankton prints. Exploring a national wildlife refuge resulted in creating images of salt march and maritime forest using India ink batiks. Examining the life cycle of butterflies and studying insect
